Kumihimo is a Japanese art form to make braids and cords, flat or circular.

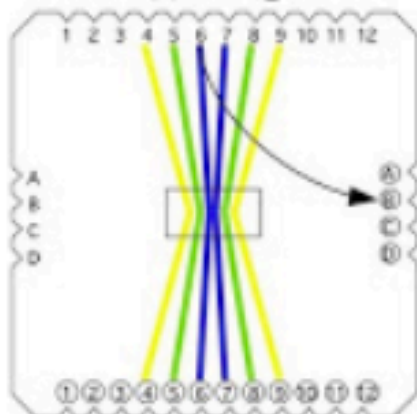
HPAC has made some boards for making flat braids. Braids can be of 8 strands and more. In general a repeat pattern is used in how to create different patterns. Our forms may not have numbers and letters in the same spots as these examples but the concept is the same, just follow the diagrams.

Cords/threads should be a minimum of 3 times the length of what is desired for the finished product. With extra for tying up.

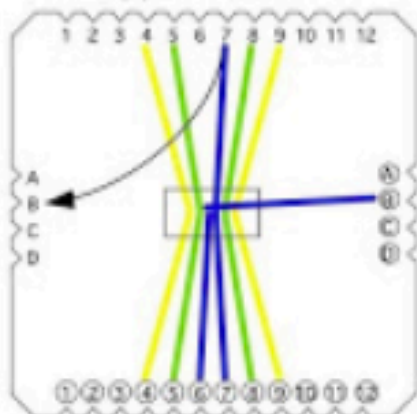
27 -36" to go around a wrist. The cords are then tied in the centre and pulled through the opening, (so five strands becomes ten for example)



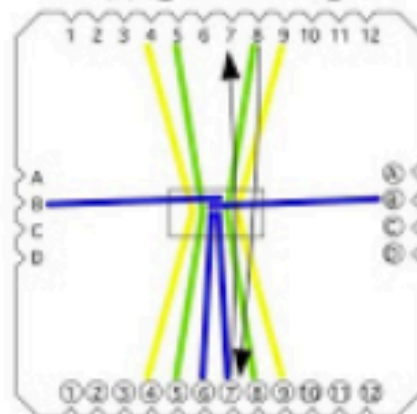
